From Direct Speech	To Reported Speech
Today.	That day.
Tonight.	Last night.
This week/month/year.	That week/month/year.
Next week/month/year.	The following week/month/year.
Last week/month/year	The week/month/year before.
Yesterday.	The day before or the previous day.
Tomorrow.	The next day.
Now.	Then or at that moment.
Here.	There.

-Tiempos verbales

From Direct Speech	To Reported Speech
<b>Present Simple</b> "I live in Benissa".	<b>Past Simple</b> He said (that) he lived in Benissa.
<b>Present Continuous</b> "I am eating".	<b>Past Continuous</b> She said (that) he was eating.
<b>Past Simple</b> "I went to the theater yesterday".	<b>Past Perfect</b> He said (that) he had gone to the theater the previous day.
<b>Present Perfect</b> "I've had a good day".	<b>Past Perfect</b> He said (that) he had had a good day.
<b>Past Perfect</b> "I had gone to the gym before I went to work yesterday".	<b>Past Perfect</b> He said (that) he had gone to the gym the previous day before he had gone to work.
<b>Past Continuous</b> "I was working hard".	<b>Past Perfect Continuous</b> He said (that) he had been working hard.
<b>Present Perfect Continuous</b> "I've been living in Barcelona for one year".	<b>Past Perfect Continuous</b> He said (that) he had been living in Barcelona for one year.
<b>Past Perfect Continuous</b> "I had been studying a lot".	<b>Past Perfect Continuous</b> He said (that) he had been studying a lot.
<b>Will</b> "I will get angry if you come late".	<b>Would</b> She said (that) she would get angry if I came late.
<b>Can</b> "I can help you".	<b>Could</b> He said (that) he could help me.
<b>May</b> "I may go to the gym".	<b>Might</b> He said (that) he might go to the gym.
<b>Must/Have to</b> "I must/have to go to Valencia".	<b>Had to</b> He said (that) he had to go to Valencia.
<b>Would/Could/Might/Should/Ought to</b> "I Would/Could/Might/Should/Ought to eat all my dinner".	<b>Would/Could/Might/Ought to</b> He said that he Would/Could/Might/Should/ Ought to eat all his dinner".
